At Springfield Community Primary School we recognise the contribution of PE to the health and well-being of the children. We believe that an innovative, varied PE curriculum and extra-curricular opportunities have a positive influence on the concentration, attitude and academic achievement all our children.

The government has provided additional funding of over £450 million over the last few years to improve physical education. Our Primary School Sport's funding has enabled us to continue and extend our provision through employing specialist coaches to deliver high quality PE lessons, to increase opportunities for competitive sports and to broaden our curriculum offer, to include a range of sports and activities. The government has increased the funding for 2017/18 academic year .
